

Restorative Justice Mediation Program

Preventing the Spiral of Crime; Bringing Healing to Communities

The Restorative Justice Mediation Program (RJMP) offers crime victims and juvenile offenders an effective alternative to the traditional criminal justice system. RJMP offers its services to probation, the police, the courts, school districts, and other service agencies. We provide juvenile offenders a chance to take responsibility and make amends as well as give the victim a voice and an opportunity to ask questions and to describe the effects of the offense. The process begins the healing for the victim, the offender, and the community.

Victim-Offender mediation differs from traditional mediation. It requires the offender to take responsibility for the harm they have done the victim. It helps to provide equitable restitution to the victim, and is proven to reduce the probability that a juvenile will re-offend.

This training will benefit Sunday school teachers, defense attorneys, and everyone in between--and especially those involved with children or teenagers. Trainees who agree to mediate cases with RJMP will receive valuable experience in conflict resolution among youth, and transferrable skills to all walks of life.
