As Mayor of the City of San Diego, I support the efforts of the Restorative Justice Mediation Program (RJMP) to seek public and private funding, and find alternatives for first time juvenile offenders.

The RJMP vision is to reduce the rising number of offenders appearing in the criminal justice system. Through supervised mediation, RJMP seeks to resolve conflicts between juvenile offenders and their victims. This program gives a judge the opportunity to bring together the youth, the victim, family members, teachers, and other community members to see if restitution, responsibility, and healing can be reached through counseling and a sharing of experiences.
